As the Memorials Officer I started planning for the 2022 activities at the memorial including ANZAC Day in June of 2021. 2022 was a special as it was 100 years since the dedication of the WW1 Memorial which occurred on the 19th of February 1922. ANZAC Day 2022 was to be the 100th time ANZAC Day had been commemorated at the Box Hill WW1 memorial.

The memorial had been looking a little the worse for wear. The Bugler was covered in black grime and mould, the gold lettering had worn away, the plinth needed some minor repairs and the surrounding wall had subsided. Thanks to a Commonwealth grant to Whitehorse City Council and Box Hill RSL we were able to refurbish and repair the WW1 War Memorial and surrounds. The repairs were finally finished one week before ANZAC Day. The Bugler is now looking resplendent again, the gold lettering looks brilliant and the surrounding wall has been straightened. New plaques have been installed, everything is ready for the beginning of another 100 years of remembrance.

The ANZAC Memorial and the RSL Ode were recited by John Sheehan and John Haward respectively. The Bugler played the Last Post, a minute's silence was observed then Reveille was played, all of which sounded beautiful in the still morning air with a mist surrounding the memorial which made it all the more poignant. Then followed the reading of the ANZAC Requiem by Chris Gray the singing of the Australian National Anthem led by Jamie Gunn, and John Haward gave the order for the Catafalque Party to dismount.

John then thanked everyone for attending inviting guests, service men and women, and volunteers back to the RSL for breakfast. Coffee and food vans were made available for the other attendees at the Dawn Service.
