THE POPPY LEGEND

The Poppy legend originated in China. A white flower from which a potent drug was distilled was called the flower of forgetfulness. Genghis Khan brought some of the seed westward, but after a battle, the flower became red, in the centre was a cross.

It was found that on many battlefields, when everything else had been laid to waste, the landscape was soon ablaze with bloodred blooms. On the Somme battlefield in 1917 after thousands of Allied casualties, the land again burst forth in a blaze of scarlet with patches of yellow charlock and white camomile.

Lord Macauley drew attention to the strange link to the Poppy with battle and put forward the suggestion it should be regarded as the flower of sacrifice and memorial.

The artificial red poppies worn on Armistice Day are more familiar to Australian and New Zealanders than the real flower.

75TH ANNIVERSARY OF PEACEKEEPING OPERATIONS

The 14th of September will mark the 75th Anniversary of Australia's involvement in international peacekeeping efforts.

Australia first sent military observers on a United Nations (UN) Consular Commission to Indonesia in September 1947, and over the intervening 75 years has had tens of thousands of military and civilian operations on station around the world.

The 75th anniversary, on the 14th of September will be marked by a Last Post ceremony commemorating the service of 16 Australians who lost their lives on UN peacekeeping operations: 10 Members of the Australian Defence Force whose names are listed on the Roll of Honour, and 6 members of the Australian Federal Police.

Those not listed are the soldiers who took their lives after returning home.

One of those soldiers is Paul Ingram, the son of Michael and Joan Ingram who are members of the WAA Box Hill Sub-Branch and great friends of this RSL. Our mannequin displays Paul's United Nations outfit, including his lanyard, the famous blue beret and various distinctive arm bands of the United Nations. Inside the cabinet is his photo taken in Somalia.

After Paul passed away, Michael and Joan donated all of Paul's army uniforms and protective armory for which we are very grateful. As I write this editorial for the 75th Anniversary, we should not forget the peacekeepers as they are deployed somewhere in our world today.

Box Hill is certainly changing, as is our RSL where we have seen many changes over the last decade and we look forward to the next phase. My heartfelt thanks go to Arthur for giving up his valuable time so willingly and for all the work he does as Treasurer for Box Hill RSL.

Claire Dubery was our entertainer on 23rd August. She has visited previously and it was good to see a familiar face. Her

repertoire included a wide variety of styles, some classical and some lighter music. Again, it was good to be able to sing along and just proves that music is great therapy.

On 13th September, three speakers from the Suburban Rail Loop Authority gave an insight into this project for which preparatory work is now underway in Box Hill. A new station is to be located in the heart of the activity centre, making it easier to access shopping, education and health services and will integrate with local tram and bus services. It will be configured over two levels underground and will be accessed via two entrances, a southern entrance at Main and Market Streets and a northern entrance at Whitehorse Road.

Construction of the SRL Station at Box Hill will be done in stages, main works beginning in 2025, with completion in 2031. The SRL itself comprises three sections, SRL East from Cheltenham to Box Hill, SRL North from Box Hill to Melbourne Airport and SRL West from Melbourne Airport to Werribee. The topic certainly created lots of discussion and many varied questions were answered by our guest speakers. We certainly live in ever-changing times and this is certainly "on our doorstep." Thank you, Jeannine, for arranging this most enlightening talk.
