

Day Section

It was good to see so many members back for our first meeting of the year in January. After our AGM, the meeting took the format of a chew'n'chat. This is really popular as it provides a chance to socialise for a longer period of time, and after Xmas and New Year, there was plenty to chat about. The Upton Room looked cheery with flags on the tables in celebration of Australia Day.

On 14th February, Ken Smithies spoke about and demonstrated Bowen Therapy. This can alleviate severe pain and aid movement of limbs by easing muscle tension. He worked on several volunteers who certainly seemed to benefit quickly and quite dramatically. Obviously more sessions with him would be needed to help remedy long-term problems. One of the main problems people 'of our vintage' experience is balance, so it is something we should all be mindful of.

Some of our members have shown a willingness to contribute to our meetings, so on 28th February we took up that offer. Raymond Reaburn spoke about money and how it has evolved here and abroad over the years. When asked whose faces appear on certain Australian notes, there was silence. Funny how we become complacent and ignore these details. We shall have to watch out for a new face to appear on our coins and notes; that of King Charles.

At the same meeting, John MacDonald recited some poems and the audience joined in with familiar ones. He even had one with a "Scottish slant." Was this specially for me, John? Thank you both for your contributions.

On 14th March, Lorraine Smith told us about a 16th Century manuscript which was found in a book in her second-hand bookshop in Warrnambool, and its journey from Gildersome in Yorkshire, England, encountering many twists and lucky escapes on its way. She showed us the original, dated 1583, made of vellum. This is calfskin which is climate-affected but can last for centuries if cared for properly. Vellum has to be treated with chalk or lime to accept ink. Though expensive, vellum was used for legal documents as it difficult to forge because of imperfections and blemishes. Lorraine's daughter helped her do research and it was found to be one half of an authentic deed for the transfer of a small parcel of land in Yorkshire. She has written a book and visited living descendants who thought the manuscript was long gone.

Thank you to the Women's Auxiliary for allowing us to join you on your recent trip to the Begonia Festival in Ballarat. The displays were spectacular. It was a most enjoyable day, topped off with a beautiful meal.

Fishing Report for 23rd February 2023

On Thursday 23rd February, 11 members of the Box Hill RSL Angling section set off on a fishing Charter.

We used the same charter company that we used in December as we had a very successful outing with them (see previous report).

Again at 6:15am on a cool, fine morning, we met at Yaringa Harbour on Westernport for a 6:30am departure, all with high hopes of catching another good feed of fish.

As we did last time, we only travelled a short distance before stopping at the first fishing spot, and it wasn't long before we started getting a few bites, but things went quiet after a very short time, so we made a few short moves to see if we could locate some fish.

As this wasn't very successful either, we made a move right across the bay towards the channels at the top end. This area didn't provide much action either, so we moved back towards Hastings. Here we got onto a good spot, and it ended up being the most productive spot of the day.

We continued to move to different locations and were able to catch a few more fish, but nothing like the number pulled out at the previous stop.

As usual, at about 11:00am, the boat captain cooked up a heap of sausages and we all had snags in bread rolls as our lunch time snack.

As the charter finished at 12:30pm, we started heading back to the harbour, but managed to stop at a couple of places on the way. But, as the wind had picked up over the last hour or so, the fish bites had slowed, and no more fish were caught.

All in all, approximately 70 odd fish were caught, the majority being whiting, with a leather jacket and a wrasse



added to the catch. Everybody was able to take home a good feed of fish, and all enjoyed the day out.

We would like to thank Box Hill RSL for their support, and Reel Adventure Fishing Charters for putting us onto the spots where we were able to catch fish again.

VALUABLE UNIFORM RETURNS HOME

After many years at HMAS Cerberus, one of our valuable uniforms returns home where it should be, the Memorabilia collection of our RSL.

The uniform, once belonged to Surgeon Captain "Sandy" Ferguson AM VRD RFD RANR Rtd. This was one of three uniforms donated to Box Hill RSL some fifteen years ago, along with his miniature medals. "Sandy" spent some time at HMAS Cerberus, before being posted the Infantry landing ship, HMAS Manoora. He also saw active service in the Southwest Pacific, taking part in the landings at Rabaul, Leyte, Lingayen Gulf and Balikpapan.

He continued his naval service following WW2 in the Naval reserve and was promoted to Surgeon Captain in 1968. He continued to serve as medical officer at HMAS Lonsdale until its closure in the early 1990's, and he then returned to HMAS Cerberus.

Many of you will remember Sandy as the Club President of the Hawthorn Football Club. Hawthorn great John Kennedy Snr. recalled the spirit in which Dr Ferguson lead the club off the field, saying "I think that the administration of a club is the important thing and Sandy was very conscious of that".
