Day commemorated at the Melbourne Shrine of
Remembrance. Consequently, it was decided by the
Vietnam Veterans Association of Australia (Box Hill
Sub-Branch) that Vietnam Veterans Day on the 18th of
August 2023 would be commemorated locally, at the War
Memorial in Box Hill Gardens.

The organising committee could not predict how many could be expected to attend the event, so it was very pleasing to see that well over 100 veterans, partners, family members and friends turned up to take part in this memorable service, despite the rain.

Charles Kook was the excellent MC of the service, with the Catafalque Party being provided by the 305 Army Cadet Unit (appropriately dressed in jungle greens). Wreaths were laid by veterans of the Vietnam War, as well as by dignitaries from government and elsewhere. The RSL President, John

Haward, laid a wreath on behalf of Box Hill RSL.

After the service, the veterans, their partners, families and friends, were invited back to the Upton Room of the Box Hill RSL for refreshments, where a great deal of camaraderie was enjoyed by all.

Seeing that the service went so well, the committee of the Box Hill Sub-Branch of the VVAA has decided to conduct the service every year on Vietnam Veterans Day, the 18th of August, for as long as it can do so, youth not being on the side of the veterans.

It was found that on many battlefields, when everything else had been laid to waste, the landscape was soon ablaze with bloodred blooms. On the Somme battlefield in 1917 after thousands of Allied casualties, the land again burst forth in a blaze of scarlet with patches of yellow charlock and white camomile.

Lord Macauley drew attention to the strange link to the Poppy with battle and put forward the suggestion it should be regarded as the flower of sacrifice and memorial.

The artificial red poppies worn on Armistice Day are more familiar to Australian and New Zealanders than the real flower.

DAY SECTION

At our last meeting in July, Paul Viney entertained us. It was a very lively performance of music mainly from the '50s and '60s, songs most of us could remember and sing along to. Isn't it great when you know the lyrics? There certainly was a buzz in the Upton Room and probably in other areas of the club as the sound travelled round the place. I was asked by several members, on departure, to rebook him, so that's always a positive sign. Maybe next time, I'll get him to turn the volume down a bit, though some did like it as it was.

On 8th August, Elida Brereton gave an illustrated talk about a cruise to the Antarctic in March 2020, just before COVID hit. One couple was not allowed to board their ship, L'Australis, because they had visited Rome and Italy was the second country to have COVID. It took two days from South America to reach the Antarctic. They visited places by going in Zodiacs (dinghies) as the ship was too large to sail into some ports. South Georgia was one place visited. It was reconquered by the British in 1982 during the Falklands War. Ernest Shackleton died in South Georgia in 1922, having returned to thank the population who had rescued him. His ship, the Endurance, had sunk after being crushed by frozen sea ice. For me, the most interesting thing Elida mentioned was Iceberg 868. It is 175 km long, 35km wide.

Marcia Rae was August's entertainer. Her repertoire is usually based around Patsy Cline and Doris Day songs and music of that ilk. Her outfit matched the era that much of her music came from viz. 1950s and 1960s. Again, fingers and feet were tapping away. There was

a delay in the start to our day's proceedings, but I'm pleased to say that Joan is now fully recovered, much to everyone's relief.

On 12th September, I spoke about how "what goes around, comes around" in education. There seemed to be a 15-year cycle in Scotland where I taught for over 30 years as an Early Years teacher. One particular aspect -- Phonics — was an important element in the early 1970s but soon was "out of favour." By the late 1990s, it was really back in vogue and teaching this was standardised in N.E. Scotland. Interestingly, in mid-August, I read in the media that here in Melbourne, there was to be an emphasis on teaching phonics.

Raymond Reaburn gave some tips on hiding valuables in the home and Wayne Bastow showed us a book he has just had printed about his life and experiences. What a wonderful way to pass on family stories and recollections and what a lovely gift to his children and grandchildren. Well done, Wayne!
