At 6:45am on a cool, fine, morning on the 9th of November 2023, a group of 11 intrepid members of the Box Hill RSL Angling Section met for the annual Vic Allen Annual Memorial Charter at Yaringa Harbour, on Westernport, for a 07:00am departure, all with high hopes of catching a good feed of fish.

A short run out the channel, on a sea that looked like a sheet of glass, we stopped at the first fishing spot, but as there was not even a ripple and very minimal current flow, the fish were shut down (not biting).

We moved around to a few different spots with sandy areas and patches of weed (ideal whiting area) and managed to start catching some fish and continued to do so until the tide had stopped running.

With the tide now turning and starting to run out, the skipper thought it was a good time to try a few different spots for snapper.

We continued to move to a couple of different locations and were able to catch a few more fish like sand whiting and flathead.

At about 11:30am, the boat captain cooked up a heap of sausages and we all had snags in bread roll as a lunch time snack.

It was about this time that a breeze had blown up and some clouds started to roll in creating small waves (large ripples) on the surface.

This must have been a signal for the snapper to start feeding and three members were lucky enough to catch a nice snapper each.

As the charter finished at 1:00pm we started heading back to the harbour and managed to stop at a couple of places on the way in.

Nothing happened to improve on the three snapper and 30 whiting we had already caught.

New member Tim Lennan won a fishing rod and reel for the most fish caught, and Bert received a \$50.00 cheque for catching the first fish.

The catch was divided up amongst the members, and everybody was happy having had an enjoyable day out.
