finals. Out of the 10 teams competing last year we were the only two left to fight out the grand final with Box Hill 2, led by captain everywhere Alex Kotros, winning.



DAY SECTION

Since no offers were forthcoming, our Committee remains the same, including "deputies." This has proved beneficial as several members have had other plans/responsibilities of late. Fortunately, we always have willing helpers ready to lend assistance when necessary. Thanks to all those involved in the running of our group.

Unfortunately, I had to deliver the news that we could not have any meetings during February as the Upton Room was being refurbished. We had to decline the offer of the Sports Bar or Deck as these were unsuitable for our needs.

Rod Moore gave us information about Travellers' Aid when he came to deliver a talk on March 12th. This is a service available at 4 venues, viz. Southern Cross, Flinders Street, Seymour and Ballarat Stations.

Southern Cross Station offers the most comprehensive service, including equipment such as buggies and mobility aids. Help with transfer from coach to train and vice-versa can be booked as can a "companion service" to help individuals attend appointments after arriving at the station. A lounge/rest area with baby-changing facilities and showers is on site and you can even recharge

phones and buggies. The other stations offer some of the aforementioned services but the hours vary. Most services are free of charge and many are carried out by volunteers. There is no limit on how often you can access these services and there is no age limit. Luggage storage is available and at Southern Cross "crisis travel" can help e.g. when you lose a wallet — they will supply a Myki . A new service is available where they will give guidance and tuition to anyone contemplating getting a mobility scooter.

Further details are available on their website as they do not distribute flyers with information. Everyone seemed interested in the talk – you never know when you might need to use it.

We meet on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday each month and new members are always welcome.

"LEST WE FORGET"

It was a beautiful day, 36 degrees, 20 years ago way back in 2004 when I attended the opening of the POW memorial at Ballarat by the Governor General of Australia General Sir Peter Cosgrove, AK, CVO, MC. In fact, history repeated itself on Sunday the 11th February when the weather was the same and the present Governor General of Australia, General David Hurley, AC, DSC, FTSE (Ret'd) re-dedicated this beautiful memorial on its 20th anniversary to a crowd of around 3000 people.

What a magnificent memorial the City of Ballarat has given everyone to view and pay tribute to all the Ex-prisoners of war. The Governor General opened the proceedings with a speech that left no dry eyes in the house. He spoke of his uncle who was a prisoner of war at Changi in Singapore. He spoke of the times he spent with him as a young boy, and he remembers the pain and suffering these brave men went through. They were such an energetic bunch of people making things out of every item they could lay their hands on. The Governor General went on to speak of Weary Dunlop and the work he did for his fellow prisoners.

The Prime Minister of Australia, the Hon. Anthony Albanese MP, spoke next and with all politics put aside also spoke of his uncle, a prisoner of war in Changi. He talked about the respect that we all gave to these prisoners and how we should never forget their sacrifice. His speech was very moving and the audience thanked him with loud applause.

Next, dressed in mayoral robes and chains, was Councillor Des Hudson OAM, Mayor of the City of Ballarat. Councillor Hudson spoke of how the residents raised the money to pay for this memorial over many years and how the architect designed this memorial which is now listed on the Victorian Heritage Register and on the Victorian War Heritage Trail '100 places for 100 years'.

The memorial to Australian Prisoners of War has 36,000 Australian men and women who were held captive as prisoners by the enemy during the Boer War, World War 1, World War 11 and the Korean War. The memorial honours them. There were no Australian POW's during the Vietnam War. The journey along the 136-metre memorial gives the visual impression that emphasises the great distance Australians travelled to war.

The paving stones forming the pathway are shaped like railway sleepers in recognition of the iconic place of railway journeys in the history of Australian prisoners of war.

The names of all known Australian prisoners of war are etched into the black granite wall lying parallel to the pathway. They give no rank, number or enlistment detail in recognition that the sacrifice, suffering and depression acknowledged no person's status. These men and women are equals.

The photo shows my wife Janice pointing to her uncle. It was great that we found him, but sad in other ways. Some years ago I was given a flag by one of our members, Ern Treloar, who was a prisoner of war in Changi. The flag was signed by all his mates there at the same time. I am currently having this flag framed and it will go on display in our new building as a tribute to these men. I promised I would keep the flag and cherish it as all our members and guests will soon be able to see. Sunday, at the 20th Anniversary of the memorial to our Ex-prisoners of war, was a great day and one that I will remember for a long time, in particular representing Box Hill RSL at this significant event.

FREE MOVIES FOR MEMBERS


